TOPIC: THE ENCHANTED WOODLAND!

<p>Visit your local library and research, woodland flowers, plants and animals and their habitats. Read and talk with an adult about the interesting facts found in the non-fiction books. Perhaps you could bring the books to school to share with the class?</p>	<p>Practise writing your numbers in words 1-20. Practise writing in 2's, 5's and 10's. Write your number bonds to 20!</p>	<p>Can you make miniature homes and gardens for fairies and pixies? Use natural materials such as bark, pebbles, twigs, leaves and pine cones. Draw a picture or take a photograph of it to show at school.</p>
<p>Write a 'who am I?' riddle for family and friends to solve. Write clues about a woodland animal, plant, or tree.</p>	<p>Compare the shape and size of different leaves and measure them using a ruler to the nearest centimetre with an adult.</p>	<p>Build a den with your family or friends. Draw a picture or take a photograph of it to show at school. Write about how you made your den and the materials you used.</p>
<p>WRITING CHALLENGE! Make a mini book or leaflet about your favourite woodland animal using facts. Research on the internet or visit the local library to find facts and information about your woodland animal.</p>	<p>MATHS CHALLENGE! Measure the width, length or height of different trees or bushes, twigs, and leaves found in your garden, local park, or woodland? Record your findings in a table.</p>	<p>CREATIVE CHALLENGE! Draw and write a plant diary. Take photographs or draw pictures to show your plant as it grows and changes each week.</p>

- Each week could you please listen to your child read and help them practise their spellings.
- You could also practise counting in different steps, go on a hunt for different 3-D shapes, talk to your child about coins and money and look at telling the time.
