<p>Design-Design a fantastic new landmark for South Wigston! What materials would you use and what special features would it have? Plot your landmark on a map of South Wigston. Present your idea to the class. Will it win a design award?</p>	<p>Maths - Go on a bridge hunt with your grown-ups around South Wigston, taking photographs to show to the class. What different 2D and 3D shapes can you identify that are used to create bridges?</p>	<p>Make - Make a detailed diagram of a castle, labelling features which might be found inside or out. Perhaps you could find out about 'murder holes', 'garderobes' or 'loopholes'.</p>
<p>Make - Design and make a model of a famous structure from around the world, using junk materials found at home. Will you choose London Bridge, the Leaning Tower of Pisa or Blackpool Tower? The choice is yours.</p>	<p>Write - Make your own information book about castles, bridges or tunnels. Include pictures, drawing and diagrams. Find at least 10 fascinating facts to amaze your family and class.</p>	<p>Research - Research Brunel a famous engineer. Use the web and/or non-fiction books to find out about his life and work.
