## Local Living and Learning – Our Curriculum Adventure


Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

- c) Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issue.
- d) Correct own child's behaviour especially in public where it could otherwise lead to conflict, aggressive behaviour or unsafe behaviour.
- e) Approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern, at an appropriate time for all involved.
