Communication regarding returning to school

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of the summer term, we could never have imagined that it would end in this way! We have seen some children return to school for a short time before we had to close again for all but children of critical workers. We have not had the chance to say goodbye as we would have wished, and we have not been able to complete our planned transition into the new academic year.

Hopefully all pupils have been able to find out a little about their new teachers through letters and videos. We will work hard to make sure your child is made to feel welcome when they finally return to school and time will be taken to get to know them well. We recognise that many children will feel anxious about coming back to school after so much time away, and we will work with you to support you and your child.

Last week the government published guidance for schools for the new academic year, allowing pupils to return to school full time from the beginning of the Autumn term. We are looking forward to welcoming all of our children back to school and meeting our new starters. The new guidance makes changes to the current arrangements, including larger groups or 'bubbles' in order to reduce mixing across the school. We will be updating the risk assessment and making sure all procedures are in place to keep pupils, staff and families safe. All information will be on the school website for the start of the new academic year.

With the support of Leicester City, Leicestershire County Council and the Trust it has been decided that all pupils will return to school on Tuesday 1st September 2020. This will ensure we have time to prepare fully for school opening with the level of care and attention to detail required. The safety of pupils, staff and all their families is our highest priority and we are determined to do the right thing in the right way.

School will reopen to pupils on Tuesday 1st September. Subject to government guidance we hope that school can open fully from this date. Transition will happen for new EYFS pupils with a phased return. We will be operating a staggered end to the day to avoid large groups at busy times. This will be reviewed and may be subject to change. Further details on social distancing measures will be communicated to you over the summer, please keep checking your emails.

We ask that children limit the amount of equipment they bring into school each day (schoolbag, coat and packed lunch if required are allowed).
