
We look forward to another busy half term when we return with lots of exciting activities for the children to engage in.



This term we have welcomed many new children to the preschool and have been amazed with how well they have settled into their new surroundings. The children have been busy forming new friendships and our group times have helped them with their social communication as well as their listening and attention skills.

The children have access to a range of equipment and resources that they are able to use for their own independent learning and adults have used these interests to extend their learning and language development. They have shown lots of interest in our open-ended resources where we have seen some great creations and the outdoor learning environment has been a particularly popular area to be in.



It has been lovely getting to know our new pre-schoolers and welcoming back those that are familiar to us, we look forward to more fun and exciting play opportunities throughout the Autumn Term!

Foundation



In EYFS this term our topic has been 'all about me'. We have learnt about our families, our homes, our bodies and our senses. We have read some fantastic books including 'Funnybones' and 'Owl Babies'. We have also been singing lots of classic nursery rhymes including, 'Georgie Porgie', 'Diddle Diddle Dumpling' and 'Pat-a-cake'.

In phonics we have been learning to read & write! We have learnt the sounds that some of the letters make, and we have been practising blending the sounds together into words. We have even learnt to read some tricky words.


In maths we have been matching, sorting, and comparing amounts. We have also been comparing size, mass, capacity as well as exploring pattern.



Year 1

In English this term we have been writing sentences, remembering the key ingredients which are writing on the line, capital letters, finger spaces, correct letter formation and full stops. We have been writing sentences all about several stories such as Rosie's Hat, Sere-n's Seasons, After the Storm and One Stormy Night. Through our English lessons, we have also been exploring the different types of weather and the seasons in which they commonly appear.

Children have also been discussing what clothes are appropriate to wear during the different weathers.



In Maths, Year 1 have just started to explore part-whole models and have been using them to write addition number sentence




Year 2 have loved our Street Detectives topic this half term.

Year 2

They have been Geographers, Historians and Artists whilst learning about map symbols and directions, how buildings have changed and how to mix colours.

They loved to see how an aerial view could be changed into a map and really enjoyed creating their own maps of South Wigston, highlighting buildings that were important to them.

During our history lessons, the children looked at local buildings and how they had changed over time. With some clever tools on the Interactive whiteboard, the children could see how a building had evolved from over 100 years ago to how it looks today. The highlight of our history topic was our special visitor Mrs Tebbutt. She engaged the children with tales of school life from over 40 years ago, including the Punishment Book she shared with them. They are very pleased that the cane is no longer allowed in schools!



In Art the children have learnt about the life of Impressionist painter Claude Monet. They are really enjoying mixing primary colours to make secondary colours and have impressed us by their creation of shades, tints and tones. They will soon be painting their own pictures linked to our class text "A House That Once Was" using a variety of tools, paint mixing and imagination!



What an amazing start to the school year we have had!



Year 3

As part of our Fantastic Factories Learning Journey, we learnt all about the industrial landscape artist LS Lowry. We used a range of painting and drawing techniques and create our own Lowry inspired art. We then moved on to History and learnt all about Orson Wright, the father of South Wigston.

Did you know he built many of the houses and factories in South Wigston?

Now, we are learning about how chocolate is made and is transported from across the Tropics to the Biscuit Factory in South Wigston. In English, we have learnt to retell and write 'Veruca in the Nut Room' (part of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl). Then, we will be adapting this to create our own Biscuit Factory story.

Whilst in maths, we have been learning to use 'place value knowledge' to help us add and subtract 3-digit numbers. We have been using dienes and counters to support our learning as well as our number bonds facts. We are also becoming more fluent with the 2, 5 and 10-times tables. Could you answer 60 questions in 3 minutes?




We are looking forward to a rest over half term so we can get back to more exciting learning in the next half term.

Year 4

Year 4 have made an amazing start to the new academic year. Children have taken on new routines, challenges and expectations with ease.

Our topic focus this half term has been **Burps, Bottoms & Bile**, in which we have explored teeth and the human digestive system.

We've enjoyed researching the different types of teeth we have, the layers which make up our teeth and how to take care of them. Everyone has been amazed by how clever our digestive system is and used their new knowledge to present facts in groups to the rest of the class.




Our class text is Demon Dentist. This story inspired us to write our own narrative about Alfie's shocking experience at the dentist and write instructions of how he should have taken care of his teeth!

Year 5

Year 5 have been extremely busy with their Stargazers topic this half term. They started by learning about Earth and Space in Science. This knowledge then allowed them to write their own non chronological report about Space in English. Next in English they have been writing a narrative about the Apollo 13 space mission. They have used fronted adverbials, dialogue, and prepositional phrases as part of their writing.

In Maths, they have been learning about the place value of numbers up to 1,000,000. They have then moved onto addition and subtractions with renaming and using numbers with 5 digits.

Our class text this half term has been George's secret key to the universe by Stephen and Lucy Hawking. We have then used this text in our guided reading lessons.



Also, in Science, we have been learning about forces such as friction, gravity, air resistance and water resistance.



Finally, it has been great to see the children becoming involved in blended learning.

They have been using TTRS, spelling shed, Century and MyOn at school and as their homework.



Year 6 have had a fantastic start to the year! Our topic has been Frozen Kingdom and we have been learning all about our world including the Arctic and Antarctic. In maths, we have been learning about numbers to 10 million and using the four operations to problem solve.

In English, we wrote fantastic non-chronological reports on the Arctic and Antarctic, explaining about biomes, climate zones and the similarities and differences between the Arctic and Antarctic. Now, we are starting a speech to persuade leaders to take action against climate change.

Year 6 also had a fantastic time at PGL!

We used our perseverance, resilience and team work to tackle challenges such as ziplining, raft building, archery, a blind folded obstacle course, giant swing, abseiling, vertical challenge and orienteering.



Forest School has arrived at Parkland

We are very pleased to announce the start up of a new provision and opportunity for children at [Parkland Primary School - Forest School](#). Forest School is an educational and inspirational process that offers children regular opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in the outdoor environment. It has been shown to provide many benefits to children, both socially, physically and emotionally.

At Parkland, sessions will be taught by Miss Brown, who is currently undertaking her Level 3 Forest School Leader qualification. The sessions take place outdoors around the school grounds, and include a range of activities, such as den building, invertebrate hunts, knot skills, outdoor arts and craft, campfires and many more.



So far this term, some sessions have already taken place with a group who have been thrilled to be able to explore the woodland area and play some games, as well as build a den, create some ideas to help identify leaves, and practise some lashing techniques.

At the beginning of this academic year, the Government changed its guidance regarding COVID cases and attendance.


The reason for the change was to ensure that, if a pupil did have symptoms or tested positive for COVID, the rest of the class would not have to isolate, so that their learning did not suffer. We are aware that many children have been off with symptoms or other illness, and we thank parents for getting PCR tests when they have been asked. This has ensured the safety of all pupils and staff within school.

Last year, we were very proud of our pupil's attendance as we finished above the **national target of 96%** despite the challenges we faced. As a school, we want to build on this success. We understand that, at the moment, attendance is lower than we would like but understand the reasons behind it. We would ask that parents and carers continue to work with school staff to ensure that children regularly attend school.

This will help us to increase our overall attendance figure which currently sits at **94.62%**. If your child is ill, please remember to contact the school office by 9am each day, to inform us of the reason for absence.
