
🌁 We also have books based on books similar to those by your favourite authors - have a look on the underground map and find what theme or author you like (eg. David Walliams). Find that coloured



I'm currently reading 'Legacy' by James Kerr. This book is about The All Black rugby team and how they always endeavour to become the best team they can be.


Author of the month


